GENERAL INTRODUCTION

ABOUT THE INSTITUTE:

Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities, Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment, Govt. of India has established National Institutes in each major area of disability, namely (i) National Institute for the Visually Handicapped, (NIVH), Dehradun, (ii) National Institute for the Orthopaedically Handicapped (NIOH), Kolkata (iii) National Institute for the Mentally Handicapped, (NIMH), Secunderabad (iv) National Institute for Empowerment of Persons with Multiple Disabilities (NIEPMD), Chennai (v) Pandit Deen Dayal Upadhyaya Institute for the Physically Handicapped (Pt. DDUIPH), New Delhi (vi) Swami Vivekanand National Institute of the Rehabilitation Training and Research (SVNIRTAR), Cuttack (vii) Indian Sign Language Research & Training Centre (ISLRTC).

These Institutes are apex-level organizations in the field of education, training vocational guidance, counseling, research, rehabilitation and development of suitable service modules for the disabled. The Institutes also serve as premier documentation and information centre in their respective areas of disability. Development and standardization of aids and appliances and preparation of community awareness materials, both of the electronic and the print media, for the target audience, the patients, the community and professionals in the field etc. are also their responsibilities.

The Persons with Disabilities (Equal Opportunities, Protection of Rights & Full Participation) Act, 1995 emphasises upon both the Central and the State Governments to take a large number of steps for the disabled, which covers both preventive and promotional aspects of rehabilitation like education, health, employment and vocational training research and manpower development, rehabilitation for persons with disability etc.

Since, the National and apex institutions deal with specific areas of disability. Their infrastructure was not adequate to provide services to all states, including less-developed regions of the country, for want of facilities. Therefore a need was felt to address the local/regional problems of PWD's and in order to fulfill the national objectives eight Composite Regional Centers for the Persons with Disabilities were established which are functioning at Sundernagar (Himachal Pradesh), Srinagar (Jammu & Kashmir), Lucknow (Uttar Pradesh), Guwahati (Assam), Patna (Bihar), Bhopal (Madhya Pradesh), Ahmedabad (Gujarat) and Kozhikode, (Kerala).

OBJECTIVES:

- To undertake development of human resources for management, training, rehabilitation, education, employment and social development of persons with Disabilities.
- To promote and conduct research in all areas relating to Multiple Disabilities.
- To develop transdisciplinary models and strategies for social rehabilitation and to meet the needs of diverse groups of people with multiple disabilities.

VISION

The quality of life of every person with disability is equal to other citizens in the country; in that live independently to the maximum extent possible.

MISSION

Through constant professional endeavors, empowering the person with disability to access the state of the habilitation intervention viz. educational therapeutic vocational, employment, leisure and social sports and cultural programmers and full participation.

HUMAN RESOURCES DEVELOPMENT:

A-Long Term Courses:

➤ Diploma in Rehabilitation Therapy (DRT)

Diploma in Rehabilitation Therapy, has been started with the overall objective to prepare a suitable manpower in the field of disability rehabilitation, who can provide the rehabilitation therapy at the district level, as well as act as a first level referral point for the grass-root level. In addition it can also take care of the training programmes of Rehabilitation professionals, care giver, school teachers at the district level. Since the student has to be imparted knowledge about the various common disabilities viz Locomotor, Speech, Hearing, Visual, Mental retardation, Learning and Multiple disabilities, it may be necessary at the operational level to involve a number of institutes dealing with the respective disability groups, especially, in terms of practical training and Internship. Therefore, the course curriculum has been framed in modular form.

➤ Diploma Course in Hearing Language & Speech (DHLS)

DHLS programme is designed to generate manpower that will cater to the need of individuals with communication disorders at the grass – root level. In this programmes the students are trained to identify individuals with communication disorders and make appropriate referrals for further diagnosis. The students are also trained to supervise the caregivers in following the guidelines given by the professionals for rehabilitation. In order to be able to carry out early identification and basic rehabilitation of individuals with hearing impairment extensive practical is given to supplement the theoretical knowledge that is imparted. They will be ideally suited to work at rural health centre, DDRC, SSA special schools for spastics, schools for the mentally retarded and school for the deaf. Pass out students shall be designated as "Speech and Hearing Assistants.

➤ Certificate course in Prosthetics & Orthotics (CPO)

The main purpose of this course is to train the students for assembly and fitting of Orthopedic appliances, artificial limbs and other rehabilitation aids under supervision of Prosthetics & Orthotics.

➤ Diploma in Special Education (DHH) DEd Spl Edu (DHH)

The Diploma Course in Special Education aims to develop professionals for special education within a broad framework of education in the current millennium. The course will enable pre-service teachers to acquire knowledge, develop competencies and practice skills to impart education to Deaf & Hard of Hearing children. The general objective of the course is to prepare special teachers at pre-Primary (Nursery, Kindergarten etc.) and primary (I to IV – lower primary and V to VII – upper primary) levels to serve in the following settings:

- Special schools
- Integrated/Inclusive setup
- Itinerant programmes

➤ Diploma in Special Education (VI) DEd Spl Edu (VI)

The Diploma Course in Special Education aims to develop professionals for special education within a broad framework of education in the current millennium. The course will enable pre-service teachers to acquire knowledge, develop competencies and practice skills to impart education to low vision & Visually challenged children. The general objective of the course is to prepare special teachers at pre-Primary (Nursery, Kindergarten etc.) and primary (I to IV – lower primary and V to VII – upper primary) levels to serve in the following settings:

- Special schools
- Integrated/Inclusive setup
- Itinerant programmes

- Forms can be downloaded from our website www.crcpatna.com and the filled in copy can be scanned and sent to our email crcpatna@nidiff.com enclosed with a D.D. of Rs. 720/- in favor of CRC Patna payable at Patna or by cash at the centre at list 15 days before the commencement of the programme
- Registration fee is Rs. 720/- for 3 days CRE programme (@ Rs. 240/- Per day as per guidelines of RCI New Delhi.)
- Participant's can choose any programme from the enclosed list of programme's as per their expertise, need & interest.
- It is mandatory to attend all the three days programme otherwise he/she shall lose his/her participation right & any participation certificate shall not be issued.
- The No. of seats per programme is restricted to 40 & initially participants shall be selected on the "first come first serve basis".
- Programme timing shall be from 9:30 am till 5:00 pm where in the working lunch shall be served to each participant along with programme kit & resources material.
- Any alteration/modification in the programme schedule venue can be changed/post/preponed as per the convenience of the centre.
- Participants are requested to read the guidelines carefully before filling up the form & ensure to fulfill the selection criteria.
- Once selected the registration fee shall not be refunded under any circumstances.
- A total no. of 18 CRE points can be accumulated by attending each programme (with 6 hours of actual training per day). Subsequently a total of 100 CRE points are to be accumulated for renewal of registration over on period of 5 years.
